Let's talk facts! APPROXIMATELY 1.2 MILLION PEOPLE IN THE US ARE LIVING WITH A DIAGNOSIS OF HIV<u>, BUT ABOUT 13% OF THEM DO NOT</u> KNOW IT.

RESEARCH SHOWS THAT WOMEN, MEN, TRANS, NON-BINARY, GAY, STRAIGHT, BISEXUAL, AND PEOPLE WHO INJECT DRUGS CAN BENEFIT FROM THE PROTECTION THAT PREP OFFERS AGAINST A NEW HIV DIAGNOSIS.

**Ochsner** Health PrEP is a medication that can prevent people from getting HIV through sex or injection drug use. When taken as prescribed, daily oral PrEP can be 99% effective against HIV from sex. Injectable PrEP, (aka cabotegravir or CAB-LA) has been shown to be even more effective than oral PrEP--99.7%, mainly because it does not rely on people remembering to regularly take a pill.

## Three kinds of PrEP

#### Once-a-day daily pill/ daily oral pill:

PrEP once a day pill is the most studied method. You take one pill a day, around the same time. Research shows this regimen works for everyone, including heterosexual, gay, transgender people, and for people who inject drugs. If you miss a dose, take it as soon as you can, or take the next dose if it's close to that time. The once a day pill your provider decides on will either be Truvada or Descovy.

### SOME OF THE REASONS PEOPLE TAKE PREP? PrEP is a good option for people who:

- May want to have sex without condoms.
- May have partners who has sex with others without a condom.
- You or your partner/s have been diagnosed with a sexually transmitted disease in the last 6 months.
- Have a partner living with HIV and you do not know if their viral load is suppressed and untransmittable.
- You or your partner/s inject drugs.
- You share needles or syringes.

If you choose long-acting injection PrEP, you will receive an injection once every two months in the buttocks. Data shows that long acting cabotegravir is effective among everyone, cisgender women, cisgender men, straight, gay, or bi, including transgender women. There is not enough evidence to support the use of Apretude with people who inject drugs. However, Apretude may be offered to people with decreased kidney function.

## **SO HOW DO I GET ON PREP?**

You and your healthcare provider should discuss preferences, risks, and benefits. However, the way you want to take PrEP and the lab results will factor into this decision.

PrEP can interact with your body, which will require on-going monitoring through laboratory tests (blood draws; swabbing) at least every 3 months. The labs are slightly different if you take oral PrEP or if you take injectable PrEP. Your doctor will monitor your kidney and liver while you are on PrEP.

## WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF PREP?

- About 3% of PrEP users still get HIV.11 Most have been due to poor adherence to PrEP (i.e., because people were not taking their pill daily).
- Of the over 1 million people who have taken PrEP as prescribed, only 20 have had a breakthrough infection.
- Oral PrEP can have an effect on the bones and kidneys, this is why you have regular labs and consults with your doctor.
- PrEP does not protect you from other sexually transmitted disease.
- A modest weight gain ( 2 pounds average) has been linked to PrEP.
