SOME THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

- It's recommended that if you're having sex, get tested every 3-6 months
- Lube is not only sexy, it's safer! More friction = more abrasions
- PrEP is for **everyone** and is even more effective at preventing HIV than condoms
- Talk to your sexual partners about their status and what they are doing to protect themselves. This is also a good chance to talk about your turn-ons, turn-offs and what makes sex enjoyable for YOU!

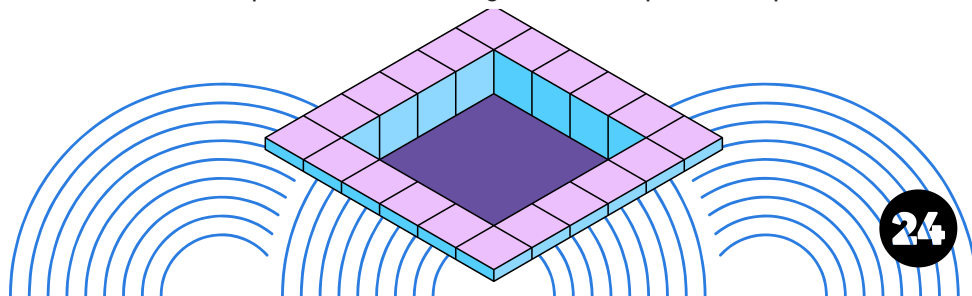

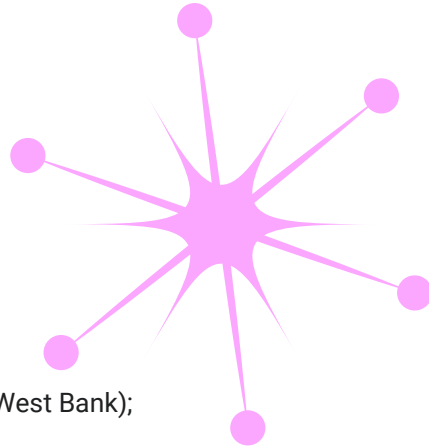
